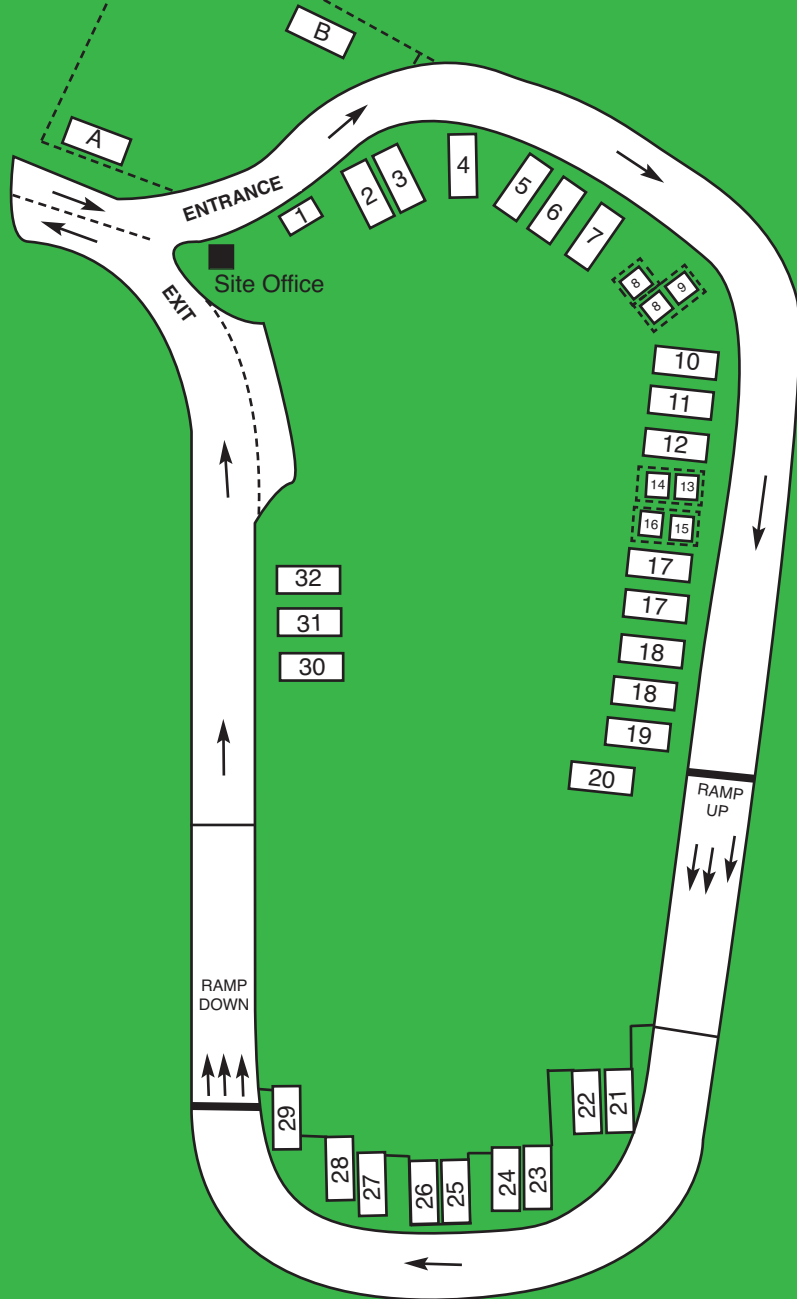

## Batteries (car)

Parts reclaimed and used in new batteries

## Batteries (domestic)

Broken down and recycled

## Bicycles

Passed to local enterprise and refurbished where possible

## Books

Passed to local charity

## Bulky material

Parts recycled and recovered (where possible)

## Food and drinks cans

Recycled into new cans

## Cardboard

Recycled by cardboard recycling company

## Carpets (rugs, tiles underlay)

Recycled (where possible)

## Garden waste

Composted

## Gas bottles

Returned to gas supply companies

## Glass

Recycled into new glass

## Electrical goods

Recycled

## Light bulbs

Recycled

## Mattresses

Parts recycled (where possible)

## Mineral oil

Cleaned and used as heating oil

## Paper

Recycled by paper company

## Plastic bottles and large domestic plastics

Recycled into new plastic containers and materials

## Plasterboard

Recycled into new plasterboard and byproducts

## Rubble

Broken down into hardcore

## Metal

Recycled by metal reprocessor

## Soil

Used for restoration purposes

## Textiles and books

Passed onto local charities

## Tyres

Shredded to be used as fuel or mixed with aggregate

## Wood

Used for the manufacture of chipboard or as a fuel
